Broad and balanced PE curriculum, enhanced by two members of Evolve three days per week.

The school has taken part in The Birmingham Catholic Primary Schools Sports Competitions: Athletics, Swimming, 7 a-side football and Cross Country.

All children at St. Wilfrid's participated in the school's Sports Day held in July 2014.



Curriculum focus of SPG spending 2013/14

We have spent the money as below:

- 1. Employed 'Evolve' to provide two sports mentors to work three days a week in our school. They provide support to class teachers in PE lessons and after school provision.
- 2. Step 8 Street Dance After School Club.
- 3. Cheerleading After School School Club.
