On **Friday** 7<sup>th</sup> October, we will be dressing in bright clothes in support of Cafod's 'Brighten Up' campaign, through which they are helping to brighten up the lives of children in need in other parts of the world. Cafod will use the money raised to support communities to grow enough food for themselves, by providing seeds and training in farming methods and by teaching people how to build greenhouses.

Also, with our Harvest Mass on **Friday 14<sup>th</sup> October**, we ask please, for children to bring in donations of tinned or packet food starting from Monday. Fresh food can be brought in on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> or Friday 14<sup>th</sup> October. We will be donating to food banks in the community.
