

This half term, in class, and AT HOME, our children will be thinking about who, in society, is not having their rights met and how we can help. Each class will be carrying out an ACT of SER-VICE after half term, so this half term they will be getting prepared—think who this will be to help and what they are going to do. If they ask to talk about this at home, please encourage them.




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Rights and Responsibilities



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EXCITING NEWS! NEW PHONICS SCHEME INCOMING!

We have invested in a new phonics programme called 'Little Wandle Letters & Sounds Revised' to teach early reading and spelling to our children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.

Over the next few weeks more information regarding this programme, and ways in which you can help at home, will be available on our website.

In the meantime, you will notice that your child will bring home a brand-new reading book from our new reading scheme, after they have confidently read it in school. Please help us by listening to your child read and talk to them about the importance of looking after their book and putting it safely back in their school bag.

Children will also be asked to take home a 'sharing book' of their own choosing, that you can read and discuss with your child. We are really trying to encourage our children to love books! With this in mind, unfortunately a charge of £5.00 will be incurred for any books that are lost or damaged. We are very excited about this new phonics journey and fostering a love of reading in our school.
