



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Talking Point

This week, Year 3 have been learning about one of the greatest painters of still life—Paul Cezanne (1839—1906)

He has been described as the father of modern art.

Picasso said he was "my one and only master and that he was like the father of us all".

He painted almost 200 still life's using the same simple household objects again and again.

He was interested in the basic shapes and richness of colour of fruit. He once said "I will astonish Paris with an apple."

After looking at the richness of colour in his painting Still Life, Pitcher and Fruit (1884) the children sketched their own still life of a single pear, using oil pastels.


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
