



Punctuality!

It has been noticed recently, that there are a number of children who are continually arriving to school late.

As a parent/carer of a child of statutory school age, you have a legal responsibility to ensure full time education suitable to the child's age, ability and aptitude and any special educational needs the child may have, either by regular attendance at school or otherwise. (Education Act 1996)

The statistics may be surprising to you

Minutes late per day during the school year	Equals days worth of teaching lost in a year
5 mins	3.4 days
10 mins	6.9 days
15 mins	10.3 days
20 mins	13.8 days
30 mins	20.7 days

Poor punctuality can lead to your child

- Feeling embarrassed in front of their friends
- Missing the beginning of vital lessons
- · Missing important instructions for the rest of the school day
- Learning bad habits which could affect their employability in the future

Let's have a big push on this for the next 4 weeks, starting from Monday, and improve punctuality!

Talk to your children about how they spread the word of God to others— is it through what they say? Or what they do?


