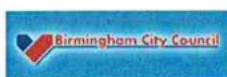
Next week, our Year 2 children will be undertaking SATs—we know that they will cope with this wonderfully, and be confident in showing off all they have learned!

Summer Term Topic Webs have been sent home and are now available on the class pages. Here you will be able to access the teaching and learning overview for your child's year group.

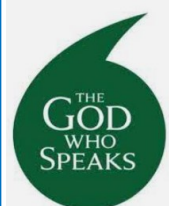
And...what a snazzy new newsletter we have! Encourage other parents and carers in your child's class to read our news online so that they don't miss out.
