
The God who Speaks


Student Ambassadors



Our new phonics scheme—Little Wandle—is now up and running and we have ALREADY seen a difference in our children's reading!.

You will notice that your child will bring home a brand-new reading book from our new reading scheme, after they have confidently read it in school.

Please help us by listening to your child read and talk to them about the importance of looking after their book and putting it safely back in their school bag.

Children will also be asked to take home a 'sharing book' of their own choosing, that you can read and discuss with your child. We are really trying to encourage our children to love books! With this in mind, unfortunately a charge of £5.00 will be incurred for any books that are lost or damaged. We are very excited about this new phonics journey and fostering a
