Lent

As a school, we are taking the opportunity to be Intentional and Prophetic this half term. We are taking time to think about how we can help others, listening to the 'God who Speaks' and demonstrating this message from God in our own lives.

On Wednesday, we marked the beginning of Lent with our Ash Wednesday Mass and prayer services. KS2 children received a cross of ashes on their forehead and our infants wore a cross on their clothes to signify that they are using this time before Easter to become closer to God through word and deed.

Our children will shortly begin undertaking their Lenten Act of Service, helping out groups in need in our local and wider community.

A reminder that every Friday between now and Easter will be a non-uniform fundraising event in return for a pound for charity. We continue to raise money for our school Lenten charities of Cafod and Father Hudson's, and, have this year, also decided that the money will be split into thirds, allowing us to make a donation to the UNICEF Ukraine Appeal. Road Safety outside of school

Please remember when dropping off and collecting your children from school to drive and park responsibly. It has restricted pavement use and makes it difficult for children and parents to cross safely. Covid-19

As we move further away from Covid -19 restrictions, it is a good time to update you on the new guidelines that we are bound to follow in school.

What will be different?

- Twice weekly asymptomatic testing is no longer required.
- Wearing of face coverings in communal areas is no longer required.
- What will stay the same?

• It is no longer a legal requirement to isolate for 5 days or more, up to a limit of 10 days, depending on when 2 negative LFDs are received. However, WE WOULD STRONGLY ADVISE YOU TO DO THIS and our advice to staff is the same.

• We will ensure good hygiene, cleaning and ventilation

It is also important to note that, in the event of an outbreak, we may be advised to return to testing, face coverings or other measures.
