Education Sunday

On <u>Sunday 8th September</u>, we celebrate Education Sunday – one of the oldest days of Special Prayer in England and Wales! Nearly 200 years ago, the Catholic Church made the education of the poor their top priority and so they started raising money to fund the national network of schools which we enjoy today. Some children will be excited to be back at school or starting for the first time, whilst others might feel anxiety. You might like to discuss these thoughts and feelings with your child and take an opportunity together to thank God for the opportunity of their education.

Values and Virtues

The two virtues we are focusing on for this half term are **Grateful and Generous**. Year 5 will be promoting these virtues and awarding children who they notice are particularly **grateful and generous**.

To be **grateful** is to be thankful for something – a gift from God, a gift from others, the blessings of each day.

To be **generous** is to share what they have with others.

Talk to your child about what they are **grateful** for. Do they remember to thank others? Do they remember to thank God? Talk to your child about how they can be **generous.** How can they share what they have?

Next week in Collective Worship, the children will be considering how they can be **generous** to others and will be asked to start bringing in gifts for Harvest Festival, which we will celebrate on <u>Friday 20th September</u>. Child Protection

Pastoral Care

This year, Mrs Theo Cropper (Family Support Worker), Ms Michelle Stephens (Attendance Worker), Mr Casey Gordon (Emotional Health and Well Being Worker) and Mr Luke Francis (PE and Health Mentor) will be working with the school to support families and children.















Attendance and Punctuality

It is vital that children attend regularly and arrive punctually if they are to make progress in their learning. Poor attendance and punctuality severely limits this learning and can cause them to fall behind their peers and often struggle to catch up. Our 'Wise Up' Attendance Programme rewards good attendance and each term 'Gold' or 'Silver' certificates will be given out for excellent attendance.

Absence during term time – please note holidays during term time will not be authorised and if taken could result in a fine. School starts at <u>8.45 am</u> and <u>12.30 pm</u> for Nursery children and <u>8.55 am</u> for children in Reception to Year 6, finishing at <u>3.30 pm</u>. The school gates will be locked at 9 am each morning to ensure the safety of the children. If your child arrives after this time, then they must be escorted by their parent to the main office.

Please inform, or make the teachers aware of who is picking up your child from school. If this changes, then please contact the school office to let us know – thank you for your co-operation.
