

Family and Community


'The Church is a family in which one is welcomed and learns to live as believers and disciples of the Lord Jesus'

This week, our Leaders in Faith have been visiting the classrooms to look for purple prayer spaces and other signs of Catholic Life. They have seen some great expressions of faith!




