School Uniform

We are making a small change to our uniform for September.

For children in Reception up to Year 6, we will be expecting ALL children to be wearing a tie.

These are available from the school office

This will mean that the children will need to wear a collared shirt—short or long sleeved

The option for your children to wear a branded or non-branded jumper/sweatshirt or cardigan remains.

If any Year 6 leavers have a tie (or indeed ANY uniform) in good condition, that they would like to donate to school at the end of term, we would be grateful to keep it in our collection of pre loved items available to donate to others at school Thank you.

Again, thank you for your responses to our change in timings for the school day. The majority of responses were in favour of this, but to answer <u>a few points</u> raised:

- The number of school hours will remain—the timings are being changed.
- The reduced numbers on the playground will allow more space to play and more children to be able to play with more activities. We have also purchased additional games for children and this will be built upon. Children will continue to be allowed to play ball games—as they are now, on set days—but the opportunities should increase due to fewer children on the area.
- For all schools, there is a requirement for a daily act of Collective Worship which, does not replace recreational time.
- The time pressure in the dinner hall should ease with fewer children in each 'sitting' to be served. If
 your child is struggling to eat at school, please talk in the first instance to their class teacher, and we
 can work together.
