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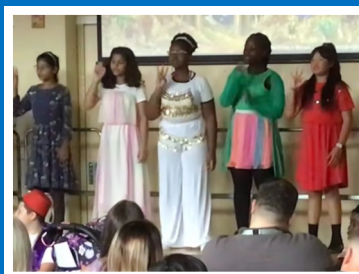

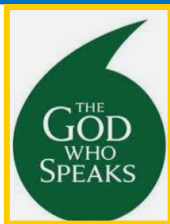

To every girl and every boy.

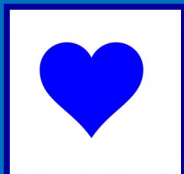
Help the teachers to enjoy the break,
