Covid-19 Update—Temporary suspension of confirmatory PCR tests

Taking a PCR test following a positive result on a lateral flow device (LFD) has been temporarily suspended from Tuesday 11 January. This means that for all children who have tested positive on a lateral flow test will no longer be advised to get a confirmatory PCR test and must isolate.

This change is informed by public health advice. With high COVID-19 rates, the risk of a positive LFD result being false is very small.

However, children should still get a PCR if they develop COVID symptoms:

- a high temperature - this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back
- a new, continuous cough - this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste - this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Covid-19 Update—Changes to self-isolation

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature.

For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to school immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.

Tips to keep your child safe online

Talk to your child - Talk to them about what they're doing online and how to stay safe. Let them know they can come to you, or another adult they trust, if they feel worried or upset by anything they've seen online. They can also get support from Childline on 0808 1111.

Explore apps and sites together - Explore what your child likes to do online together. This can help you to understand why they're using certain. Explore the features that are available, which would include privacy settings, location settings, and how to block and report.

Agree what's appropriate together - Agree your own rules as a family when using apps, sites or games. You can use our family agreement template to help get you started.





Check your settings – Check the technology your family uses and use privacy and location settings to keep your child safe. You can call your mobile and broadband provider to find out how to do this or visit our [parental controls page](#) to find out more.

Please encourage your child to have a school dinner on this day as a large proportion of school funding for the year is based on how many children take up a school meal on Census Day. Thank you.

Friday 21st January- Sepsis awareness day

Next Friday, the children will be learning about Sepsis using resources developed by the UK Sepsis Trust. The children will be taught what sepsis is, the signs to look out for and what to do if they suspect someone has sepsis. To launch our awareness day, the fundraising manager for UK Sepsis Trust will be delivering an assembly to the children.

Sepsis is the body's overreaction to an infection where, instead of fighting an infection, our immune system attacks the body's own organs and tissues. It affects 245,000 people in the UK every year and claims 48,000 lives. But it is estimated, with better awareness – leading to faster diagnosis and treatment – thousands of those lives could be saved every year. That's why it's important that we all know about it.

The children are invited to wear something red on this day, in return for **£1** per family to help raise money for UK Sepsis Trust.
