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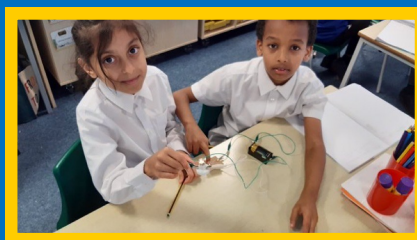

Year 5 enjoyed 'Bikeability' this week, which was really successful . It's so important that our children develop these cycling skills, particularly as they become older and gain more independence.

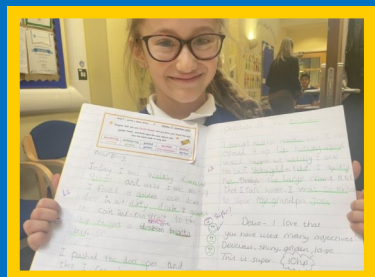
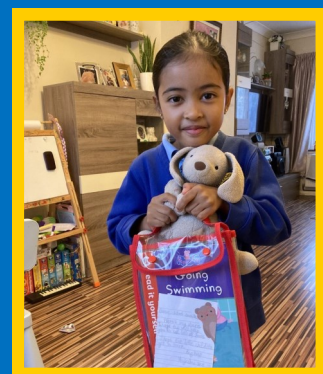

Next week marks the start of a very important week in our school calendar- **Anti-Bullying week!** The theme for this year is **Reach Out!**

The Anti-Bullying Alliance defines bullying as:
"the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power."

The theme of "**reach out**" has been carefully chosen this year, as preventing and combatting bullying all starts by the children reaching out. Whether it's in our school, at home, in the community or online, let's reach out and show each other the support we need.

Next week, in school, we will be discussing with the children the importance of reaching out to someone you trust if you need to talk. We will also be covering the importance of reaching out if you suspect somebody else is being bullied. Together, let's be the change we want to see. Reflect on our own behaviour, set positive examples, and create kinder communities. So, let's all come together for this Anti-Bullying Week and reach out to stop bullying.

At the end of Anti-bullying week on **Friday 18th November** an activity will be sent home for you to complete with the children all linked to Reach Out! You need to design a "helping hand"- on each finger you need to write the name of a person you could go to if you ever feel worried. Please return these hands to school by **Friday 25th November** so that we can make a whole school display of helping hands.





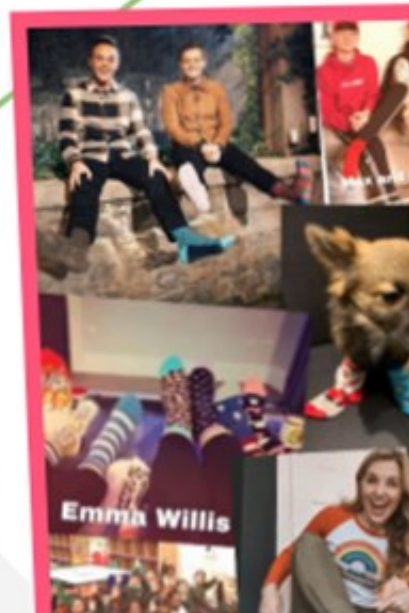
WOOHOO... MONDAY 14TH NOVEMBER IS ODD SOCKS DAY!

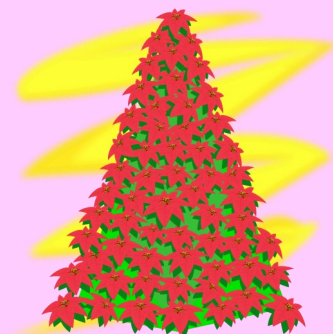
