



### Strategy for home learning for cases relating to Covid-19

The expectations for school, as set out by the DfE and OFSTED, is that there should be available high-quality online provision for children who are having to self-isolate, either individually, or as part of their 'bubble'. The expectation is that this provision should match the curriculum content of each day as closely as possible. We will ensure our children still have access to a broad and balanced curriculum whilst at home.

We will provide learning online via eSchools, for which children have a log in. Resources will be uploaded to mirror the school day to ensure the children have meaningful and ambitious work each day in several subjects. **This will only be for children not attending school in circumstances related to Coronavirus.**

We know that you will support us at home with this learning to ensure that your child is able to continue to access the curriculum alongside their peers. **Please inform us if you do not have internet access or access to a device such as a computer, tablet or similar.**

If the class teacher is unwell, another staff member will be given time to upload work to eSchools ensuring as much continuity as possible.



What to do if my child is isolating	
1. Accessing your child's online learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Log on to eSchools using the details sent home.</li> </ul>
2. What will learning look like?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We will be using work set by teachers and resources such as including Mathletics, Reading Eggs and Oak National Academy. All of this work can be found on your child's homepage on eSchools.</li> </ul>
3. How much work should your child do?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We aim to keep the curriculum as broad and ambitious as possible. Your child should do ALL of the work set.</li> </ul>
4. How will you share learning with your child's class teacher?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Responses can either be uploaded onto eSchools using the button underneath the set task, <b>OR</b> can be typed onto eSchools, in the box that says '<a href="#">...or write your homework below</a>'</li> </ul>
5. How will my child know how well they are doing?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Teachers will check work daily to enable them to adjust the pace or difficulty of what is being taught.</li> <li>Daily feedback will be given by teachers through eSchools.</li> </ul>
6. What do I do if I am not sure what to do or my child is finding it tricky?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Contact your child's class teacher via their school email address, which your child will be given on their eSchools class homepage.</li> </ul>
7. Does my child have to complete the work set?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Yes. Children not completing their work will be contacted by school. We are asking all parents to ensure that children are keeping up with their work.</li> </ul>
8. What do I do if my child is unwell and too ill to complete the set work?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Please inform us. They will not be expected to complete home learning if this is the case.</li> </ul>
