- Elvis Presley or just Elvis was an American singer, musician and actor
- He is regarded as one of the most significant cultural icons of the 20th century and is often referred to as the "King of Rock and Roll" or simply "the King".

- •He was known for his very energetic dance and performance styles
- •He was drafted into the military in 1958
- •He won many awards including 3 Grammys

# Jean-Michel Basquiat

- An important artist from the USA.
- Born on 22nd December 1960.
- His parents split up when he was young and he mainly lived with his dad because his mum was sometimes unwell.
- From a young age, Jean-Michel enjoyed art.
- Created his own drawings of his favourite cartoon characters, comics and biblical scenes.
- When he was seven years old, Jean-Michel and his friend (Marc) created their own children's book.

In 1967, Jean-Michel was knocked over by a car. He had to have an operation and spent a long time in hospital. To help pass the time, Jean-Michel's mum gave him a book used by doctors to learn more about the human body. Jean-Michel copied lots of the pictures from the book.

When he was 17, he started creating graffiti art under the tag SAMO, and quickly became famous, appearing on TV and magazines. By 21, he started painting and his work was displayed in art galleries. He used oil pastels, crayon, spray paint and pencil. He liked to collage ideas together.

John-Michael didn't go to art college, he just took inspiration from things around him. He was inspired by diversity and lots of his later work explores the power and vulnerability of various groups of people who have been at risk of discrimination or oppressed.

He travelled the world showing his art and became friends with famous artists and created a painting with Andy Warhol.

Within a few years he was making 1 million dollars a year selling his paint-


Many of Jean-Michel's paintings featured cartoon-like figures.


Our Spotlight Author of the Week is Year 1's Author



We are proud to announce that we have been awarded the

## Modeshift Stars Silver Award,

for our whole school initiative in promoting sustainable travel, and achieving a reduction in car use on the journey to school

### What is Modeshift Stars?

Modeshift STARS is the national school's awards scheme that has been established to recognise schools that have demonstrated excellence in supporting cycling, walking, and other forms of sustainable travel. The scheme encourages schools across the country to join in a major effort to increase levels of sustainable and active travel in order to improve the health and well-being of children and young people. Every school in England (outside of London) can participate in Modeshift STARS for free. On completion of an application for Modeshift STARS, schools will automatically have a brand new national standard School Travel Plan.

# How did we achieve the Silver Award?

Whole school participation in travel surveys and moving from high fossil fuel transport to more environmentally friendly options. These include pupils moving from a taxi to a bus/bike. Mrs Dunleavy has continued to work on our travel plancarrying and delivering 20 Sustainable Travel Initiatives, 10 Supporting Initiatives and establishing a travel team within school.




