tions to make lunchtime memorable.

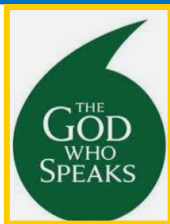

This morning, there was an incident between parents in cars, on the road, outside of the school gates.

A number of parents were upset by the language used and the aggression involved.

This behaviour around the school premises is unacceptable and not in line with our school ethos of Love, Care, Share and Respect.

As you know, we have managed to reduce the congestion around school by altering arrangements whereby children can come straight into school between 8:45am and 8:55am on being dropped off and also by encouraging those who live locally to walk or, for others to 'park and stride.'

This incident has been logged with the police, with photographs of the vehicles involved. The photograph also clearly shows one of the vehicles involved mounting the pavement, which we have also requested does not happen, for the safety of pedestrians, which includes our children.

Thank you to those who continue to maintain a safe environment around school.



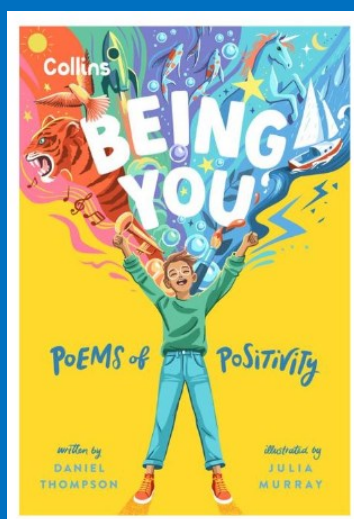
