School Uniform

We are now back to our Winter Uniform which is:

Boys - Grey trousers, white shirt, blue school jumper, school tie, grey socks

Girls – Grey skirt, pinafore or grey school trousers, white blouse, blue school cardigan/jumper, school tie, white/grey socks or tights.

Please note footwear should be black sensible shoes.

All uniform should be labelled with your child's name. Each year we have vast amounts of uniform unclaimed in our lost property.

Child Protection

St Wilfrid's is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all children and young people. The school is an agent of Social Services and in certain circumstances, if there are major concerns about a child, advice from, or referral to Children's Services may be made. This is a legal obligation of the school.

Attendance and Punctuality

For the children to make the very best progress in their learning, they need to be in school every day. Poor attendance and punctuality severely limits this learning and often causes them to fall behind their peers and struggle to catch up.

Our 'Wise Up' Programme rewards good attendance. Each term children achieving over 97%+ for that term will receive a 'Gold' certificate and entered into a draw for a chance of being one of 20 £10 cinema voucher winners. Any child achieving 100% attendance over the whole year will be involved in a 'special school treat' at the end of the year!

(Last year we visited Star City to see 'The Incredibles' and finished off with a Happy Meal!).

Please note re absence during term time – holidays during term time will not be authorised and if taken, risk a fine.

School starts at 8.55 am for children in Reception to Year 6, finishing at 3.30 pm.

Our Nursery starts at 8.45 am and 12.30 pm.

The school gates will be locked at 9 am each morning to ensure the safety of the children.

If your child arrives after this time, then they must be escorted to the main office.

Please inform, or make the teachers aware of who is picking up your child from school. If this changes, then please contact the school office – thank you for your co-operation.
